### 2015 ANNUAL CAMPUS SECURITY REPORT, October 1, 2016

#### PCI Security Policy & Procedures

1. PCI does not maintain a campus police force; security is limited to a part-time parking lot security attendant to monitor entrance of vehicles and individuals onto PCI property. Any on-campus occurrences of criminal activity or emergencies will be reported to the appropriate local police, fire, or emergency medical authorities.
2. Students or school staff who witness criminal activity or emergencies should immediately report the incident to the School Director, who will contact local authorities. In the event of an extreme emergency, local police, fire or medical emergency authorities should immediately be contacted, and the School Director may be subsequently notified.
3. PCI will notify the campus community in a timely manner of any occurrences of crimes listed below.
4. PCI will publish an Annual Campus Security Report, which will contain statistics regarding on-campus occurrences of these crimes, statistics regarding on-campus arrests for liquor-law, drug-abuse, weapons violations and statistics regarding incidents of domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault and stalking.
5. The above report will be published each year by October 1<sup>st</sup>, in accordance with federal regulations, and is distributed to all current students and employees. Prospective students and employees will be notified of the availability of the report and provided a copy upon request.

#### Crime and Drug-Abuse Prevention Programs

During Orientation for new class starts, the PCI Security Policy & Procedures is reviewed to insure all new students are aware of the need to report any criminal activity or emergency to PCI school officials. In addition, all students and staff are advised to always be aware of their personal surroundings while on campus and avoid potential situations where personal safety may be at risk. A number of drug and alcohol abuse prevention programs operating throughout the Dallas-Fort Worth metroplex area are available to PCI students and staff. Information regarding these programs is posted in all staff and student break areas.
